Letter from MNH Director, September 2015

Dear Friend,

I thought you may like to have an update on some of our recent projects, which have included the following:-

House of Manannan: New Kingdom of Man Gallery

In April 2015 FMNH agreed to contribute up to £80k from its charitable funds toward the transformation of the Kingdom of Man Gallery at The House of Manannan. This is part of a wider capital programme to refresh galleries and museums at Manx National Heritage.

The new gallery and external courtyard development will energise tired spaces and tell the rich story of the powerful Kingdom of Man & the Isles between AD 1000 and 1300. FMNH funds have been specifically targeted at improving the courtyard area which is now a flexible and beautifully designed space which can be used for evening functions and corporate hire as well as for public programming events.

Investment in the courtyard has brought back into use a previously run down area which has been inaccessible for several years. The new courtyard – with interactive games and activities -- will directly appeal to family audiences and is due to open in October.

Secret Treasures: Modern British & Irish Art on the Isle of Man

Manx National Heritage and the Isle of Man Arts Council are hosting an exhibition of paintings by leading artists drawn from private collections on the Isle of Man which opens to the public on 17th October at the Manx Museum and runs until 28th November. The show has been curated by international auction house Christie's and is accompanied by a beautiful catalogue. It will provide a unique opportunity for a wide audience to see these usually hidden treasures. There may be an opportunity for a small number of FMNH members to take a private tour of the gallery on Friday 16th October. Rushen Abbey

In November 2014 FMNH agreed up to £80,000 toward archaeological management at Rushen Abbey. This included the commissioning of a detailed narrative report on the excavations which took place between 1998 and 2008. A full assessment of the archive will be researched and the report written by the director of the excavations, Dr Peter Davey. The project has started and is expected to be delivered in 2016/17.

Funds will also allow excavations to be completed to a professional standard in a small area in the southern half of the site which will then enable the provision of a safe area for anchoring points for event marquees. Further landscaping in the northern half of the site will tidy up previous archaeological activity, securing archaeological remains, removing fencing and reinstating pathways. It is hoped that this work will also be delivered in 2016.

The Peggy

In 2014 FMNH committed up to £50,000 toward the fit--out of the new conservation facility at Cooil Smithy for the Peggy. As many of you already know, Peggy was moved to her new home in January 2015 and was protected for the first few months in a purpose-built insulated close-fitting box in order to stabilise temperature and humidity. Meanwhile preparation of the conservation facility has been completed and Peggy can be thoroughly assessed in an appropriately conditioned and constantly monitored environment using equipment purchased by FMNH. Several of you have already had the opportunity to visit the facility with Christopher Weeks, conservator at MNH and it is intended that future visits will be made possible.

Project Archivist

In November 2014 FMNH agreed to contribute toward the recruitment of a professionally qualified project archivist for 12 months in partnership with MMNT. The archivist will provide top--level summaries for iMuseum of all the major manuscript collections in the National Archive. These include business records, historic public records, Isle of Man diocesan records, Methodist church records, voluntary and charitable organisations (associational records) and papers of private individuals. This will dramatically improve information about the extent of each archive through summary descriptions on iMuseum and will provide a framework for future more detailed cataloguing projects.

Eleanor Williams took up the position of project archivist with Manx National Heritage in September 2015. Eleanor is from the Isle of Man and has just

completed her post graduate MSc in Information Management and Preservation (Digital/Archives/Records Management) at the University of Glasgow.

Horticultural Manager Post

Following a generous bequest to FMNH in 2014 from the estate of the late Professor Bucke, it was agreed with his executors to support the creation of a 3 year post to address horticultural management at Manx National Heritage sites. This post has now been advertised and interviews will take place in October.

As ever, I thank all members of FMNH who have volunteered to help MNH over the year. Your time and enthusiasm is much appreciated.
