<u>Labyrinth – All at Sea</u>: A new promenade performance at the House of Manannan. Two hundred years ago, Sir William Hillary founded the RNLI motivated by witnessing losses of ships and lives around the Isle of Man. Around 2,000 shipwrecks have been recorded in Manx waters but their stories have not been lost. Inspired by historical events, come along and hear maritime tales of tragedy, bravery, survival and a little looting! Rods and Rockers Tours continue at the Great Laxey Wheel, offering a behind the scenes look at the second phase of essential conservation repairs at our world-famous waterwheel. Led by contractors at CCJ Group, discover the work taking place on the splendid rod duct, T Rocker and bogies! Building on the success of the award-winning Phase 1 Laxey Wheel conservation project, Phase 2 will fix the broken rod mechanism and re-connect it to the Lady Isabella. This will smooth and balance the operation of the wheel and put less stress on Lady Isabella for years to come. More than 250 litres of lime wash will be applied to the rod duct after repointing in traditional lime mortar. And when works are complete at the end of the summer scaffolding will be removed to reveal the splendour of one of our most popular heritage sites. Tickets are available here.
